

On the 28th of August, some of our wonderful Sri Lankan staff brought a little taste of home to share with everyone!


Residents, staff members & families alike enjoyed traditional food, music, dancing and a splash of island culture - all in the comfort of our communal area.

Garden Updates






Our residents didn't need to worry about the August sunshine - there's plenty of shade to go around.
